Wetlands are very important to the environment because they do many important things for the climate, like




- Water purification: Wetlands help to filter pollutants from water, improving its quality.

Is Udaipur wetland is Ramsar Site?

 Udaipur is not yet a Ramsar Site, no. It is being worked on by the government of Rajasthan to become a Ramsar Site, though. The state government started the Udaipur Wetland City Project in 2021. Its goal is to make Udaipur a leader in wetland cities in India and around the world. Udaipur would be the first swamp city in India to be named a Ramsar Site, which is a very important honour. With this, the state of Rajasthan and the whole country would have made a big step forward.

What does Ramsar Site mean?



 Based on the Ramsar Convention, a Ramsar Site is a wetland area that has been named as being of international value. It is a worldwide agreement to protect and use wetlands in a way that doesn't harm them. It has 172 member states and was signed in Ramsar, Iran, in 1971.

To be designated as a Ramsar Site, a wetland site must meet one or more of the following criteria:

- It contains a representative, rare, or unique example of a natural or near-natural wetland type found within the appropriate biogeographic region.
- It supports vulnerable, endangered, or critically endangered species or threatened ecological communities.
- It plays a significant role in regulating water regimes or supporting wetland species during their annual cycle.
- It is an important source of food for birds.

Why is Udaipur becoming a wetland city?

- There are several important lakes in Udaipur. Some of them are Pichola Lake, Fateh Sagar Lake, and Swaroop Sagar Lake. These marshes are very important to the economy and ecosystem of the city.
- The government of Rajasthan is trying to protect and restore the wetlands around Udaipur. The state government started the Udaipur Wetland City Project in 2021. Its goal is to make Udaipur a leader in wetland cities in India and around the world.

Benefits of becoming a wetland city:

To become a wetland city, many good things happen. Some of these are:

As part of the NLCP, several steps have been taken to protect and repair Udaipur's lakes. Among these steps are:


